

Supplementary material in Ecography

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The supplementary data may take the form of figures, tables, datasets, derivations, formulas, videos etc. Authors should express their intention to include SM with their paper when submitting. In addition, editors may suggest that part of the submitted data could be more suitably presented online only to save journal space and to focus the article. Authors who place detailed materials and methods in SM must provide sufficient detail in the main article methods to enable a reader to follow the logic of the procedures and results and must also provide reference to the online methods. If a paper is fundamentally a study of a new method or technique, then the methods must be described completely in the main article.

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Supplementary material should be cited in the main text of your article, just like other figures and tables are. The SM is cited as, e.g.

‘...(Supplementary material Appendix 1, Fig. A1)’

(where ‘A1’ denotes Supplementary material Appendix). Equations are denoted as Eq. A1, Tables as Table A1, etc....

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
